Trapping Cockroachesⁱ

Smear the top inside of a jar with petroleum jelly (Vaseline, for example) to prevent cockroaches from escaping. If these cockroaches are to be held for several weeks, place them into a suitable container such as a box or large jar. Be certain that there is sufficient air for the cockroaches. Place a piece of potato, apple or dry dog food along with water. The best way to provide water is to put a cotton plug into a small container filled with water. Place a cardboard tent into the container as a resting place for the cockroaches.
