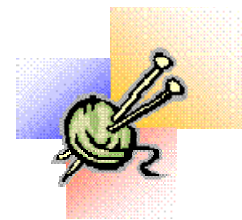




Holes and Ridges Knitted Dishcloth

You will need:

Worsted weight cotton yarn

Knitting needles, size 8 or size needed for gauge

Gauge: 9 sts = 2"

Finished size: 9" square

Cast on 43 sts.

Rows 1-8: Knit across. (Four ridges on each side)

Row 9: K5, *YO, K2 tog, repeat from * across to last 4 sts, K4.

Rows 10-13: Knit across. (Two ridges on each side)

Rows 14-68: Repeat rows 9-13 eleven times. (Twelve rows of hole pattern)

Rows 70-77: Knit across. (Four ridges on one side, three on other)

Bind off all sts in knit.
